




Average farmer's income

Entrepreneurial income per family work unit compared to average wages in the economy, EU-28




Farmers' Income, CAP subsidies and Gross Wages and Salaries in the total economy per MS



* Rapporteurs selected in June 2018
* Reports presented in Comagri in November 2018
* Amendments tabled by 3rd December 2018
* Amendments: analysis & compromises Jan-Mar 2019
* Vote in Comagri took place:
* 1st April – MEP Andrieu report - Single CMO

* 2nd April – MEP Herranz report - CAP Strategic Plans

* 8th April – MEP Müller report on Horizontal regulation

* No vote in EP Plenary before the European elections



State of play in the European Parliament (2)

* EP will continue with previous Comagri work (CoP decision)

* New rapporteurs selected in Sep./Oct. 2019
* CAP Strategic Plans: MEP Peter Jahr (EPP, DE)
* Single CMO: MEP Eric Andrieu (S&D, FR)
* Horizontal regulation: MEP Ulrike Müller (RE, DE)
* No clear idea of the work method and procedure yet
* Uncertainty on the timeline of the process in the EP


* Work started during Austrian Presidency
* Progress report at December 2018 Agri Council
* Romanian Presidency ambition for a partial general agreement by the end of June 2019

* Reality: Progress report by Romanian Presidency 18th June 2019

* Finnish Presidency of the EU – 2nd Semester 2019

* Impact from other areas: Brexit, MFF, renewal of EU Institutions
