## Repair and Maintenance Information (RMI) > finalized ISO standard

ISO/TC 23 *“Tractors and machinery for agriculture and forestry”*,

- Having considered the report of the convener and the publication of ISO 22172-1:2020 and the future publication of ISO 22172-2

*Decides to disband WG 5 following publication of ISO 22172-2,  
Warmly thanks WG 5 convener and all experts for the work done.*

The decision was taken by *unanimity*.

- With this approved ISO standard, new tractors build after July 1 2021 should be available to connect and communicate through the OBD/ISOBUS if this connector solution is mounted by the manufacturer.
- We haven't seen an official publication of the ISO standard till now. We have to figure out how the RMI possibilities will work out in practice!



## Code of Conduct on Agricultural Data Sharing

The EU code of conduct on agricultural data sharing was created jointly by the signatory organisations to provide support on contractual relations and provide guidance on re-using and sharing agricultural data.

As a basis, the code of conduct provides definitions for roles and processes in data sharing in agriculture. Based on those definitions the code of conduct introduces default principles related to five categories:

- Attribution of the underlying rights to derive data (Also referenced as data ownership)
  - Data access, control and portability
  - Data protection and transparency
  - Privacy and security
  - Liability and intellectual property right

- Initiative first launched on 23rd of April 2018
  - CLIMMAR joint a year later as co-signing party
  - Several language versions are published (ENG/ES/FR/IT) and some are pending (NL/DE/Pol/RO) and soon ready to be published



## EU Working Group on Agricultural Tractors (WGAT)

- A common position paper (CLIMMAR/CEETTAR/COPA-COGECA) was published aiming to ensure that the Mother Regulation EU167/2013 does not conflict with national regulation concerning masses and dimensions of agricultural machines. The reason is that some member states have a tradition for allowing vehicles with larger masses and dimensions than when approved after EU167/2013. Those member states must be secured the possibility to continue using national legislation, when having the necessary infrastructure to support e.g. machinery wider than 3.0 meters, and different tire configurations necessary for the different seasons and soil types (to minimize the soil impactation)
- Several meetings have taken place but a final decision is not taken yet. On the 25<sup>th</sup> of May there is an informal meeting with CLIMMAR/CEETTAR/COPA-COGECA and CEMA on this subject. A next official WGAT meeting is not known at the current moment.



# WG on Non-Road Mobile Machinery

## General file on Type Approval issues

- The goal - primary from the manufacturers, but also from the EU Commission is to make similar type approval as 167/2013-EU for tractors and agricultural machinery - on these NRMM vehicles.
- One big goal for the manufacturers is to bring down the manufacturers costs for approvals when they bring the machines on the market in the different EU countries
- The next meeting is scheduled to May 6 2021.



## New initiatives within OECD

First contacts of Per Hedetoft into:

- OECD Sub Working Group regarding electric tractors. Meeting scheduled on 8-9 of June 2021
- OECD Sub Working Group regarding robot tractors. Meeting scheduled on 15-16 of June 2021
- OECD Sub Working Group on Tractor Codes. Meeting scheduled on 26-27 of May 2021



## **Sectoral alliances (with CEMA/CEETTAR/COPA-COGECA)**

### **Growing theft problems of ICT hardware in machines**

- CETTAAR, CEMA, CECE and CLIMMAR are also meeting outside EU and ISO norms, trying to find some ways, to solve the increasing problems with theft off various equipment such as monitors, antennas, complete GPS systems and sensors but also Diesel Particle filters are becoming a subject for thieves.
- The manufacturers in the agriculture industry are aware of this problem, but CECE – organizing manufacturers in the construction machinery industry do not see this as a known problem in this kind of industry yet
